SHEPHERD CENTER

Shepherd Center is a private, not-for-profit, hospital located in Atlanta, Ga. Founded in 1975, Shepherd Center specializes in medical treatment, research and rehabilitation for people with spinal cord injuries, brain injuries, multiple sclerosis, chronic pain and other neurological conditions. Shepherd Center is ranked by *U.S. News & World Report* among the top 10 rehabilitation hospitals in the nation.

OUR STAFF AND FACILITY

- Our main campus is located at 2020 Peachtree Road in the Buckhead community, about four miles north of downtown Atlanta.
- The facility has 132 beds, including a 10-bed intensive care unit.
- Shepherd Center employs more than 1,330 full- and part-time employees.
- Outpatient facilities house spinal cord and brain injury day programs, a multiple sclerosis center, urology services, a chronic pain center and assistive technology services.
- Shepherd Center has a fitness center, indoor pool, gymnasium, weight room, track and art studio.
- Shepherd Center is one of 14 Model System of Care facilities for spinal cord injury.
- The hospital offers community-based care for people with brain injury through Shepherd Pathways and Spring Creek House, located a few miles from Shepherd Center.

- Shepherd Center had 913 admissions to its inpatient programs in 2010.
- Shepherd Center had 535 admissions to its day patient programs in 2010.
- 6,316 people were seen on an outpatient basis in 2010.

- NeuroRecovery Network (NRN) – Shepherd Center is part of the Christopher and Dana Reeve Foundation's NRN program, which is designed to develop and provide therapies to promote functional recovery and improve the health and quality of life for people with paralysis.

- Beyond Therapy® – This program is available at Shepherd Center in Atlanta and at a satellite location near Nashville, TN.
- Shepherd Center provides intensive and comprehensive family and patient education and training to learn important information about spinal cord or brain injury and care.
- Marcus Community Bridge Program – Specialists at Shepherd Center track and follow progress of patients after discharge to make sure the skills learned during rehabilitation are applied at home and in the community. They also help coordinate equipment needs, arrange for follow-up care and assist with back-to-work or back-to-school goals.

- Shepherd Center is ranked as one of the top 10 rehabilitation hospitals in the nation by *U.S. News & World Report*.
